Our Mission

Story Link® Program is designed to strengthen the bonds between offenders and their children and to provide opportunities for Christian witness. Offenders who are 90 days free of violations are allowed to select a book provided by the Program. They then read the book and say a short message to their child on a cassette tape under the supervision of a volunteer. They may also write a message in the book. The volunteers send the tape and book to the child at no cost to the offender or their family. The Program is totally supported by donations and volunteers pay their own expenses. The Program is in 12 state prisons in Missouri and two Federal prisons in Illinois, but God's vision to us is to impact the lives of offenders and their families from 40 prisons.

Story Link Celebrates 10th Year of Ministry

It's hard to believe, but Story Link Program is 10 years old this year. It began in September 1998 at the women's prison in Vandalia, Missouri. Since then, over 30,000 books have been read and sent to the families of offenders at the 14 prisons we serve. Stamping Party at Rock Hill Baptist Church Processes Over 8,000 Books!

Twenty-five volunteers and friends of the Program from

as far away as Eldon, Missouri came together on March 15th to clean, sort, stamp and repack about 8,000 of the roughly 10,000 books donated to the Program since May, 2007. Shown below are six Girl Scouts from Troop 2962 who attend Claude Brown Intermediate School in Troy, Missouri and their leader, Peggie Enloe, They collected over 700 books at a Bingo night last fall and then joined



the party to help stamp theirs and the rest of the 8,000 donated books with the Program name! Thank you girls!
